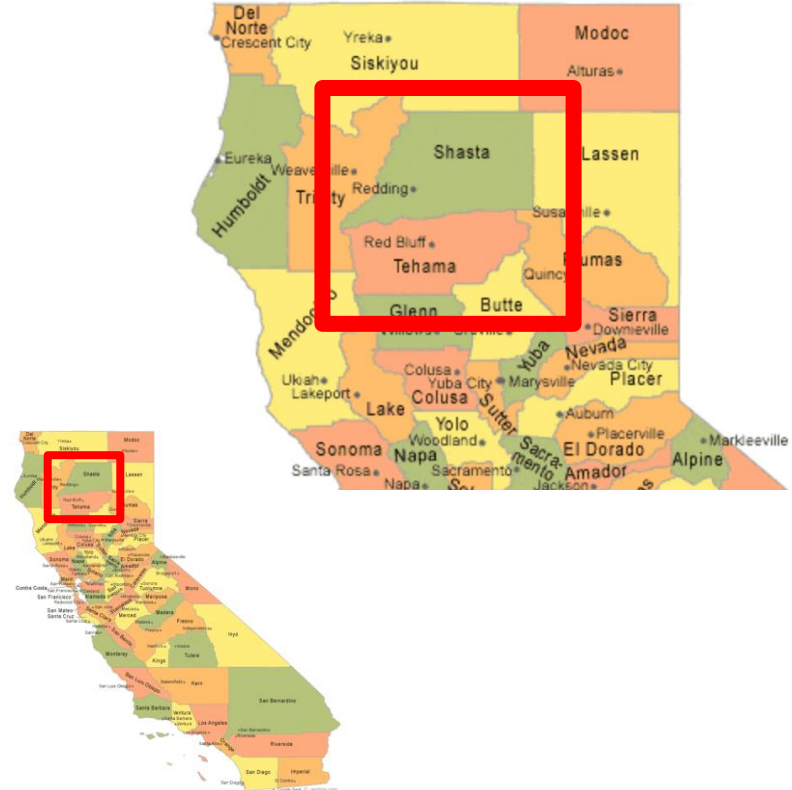

REHAB-

The Self-Help Rehab Program is funded by the USDA Rural Development and/or the USDA Housing Preservation Grant. Loans and Grants are provided to make repairs on homes located in the designated rural areas. For a two year period, the program helps 32 to 42 jobs. Within the last two years, our company has lowered our units due to a lack of increase of funding to cover expenses.

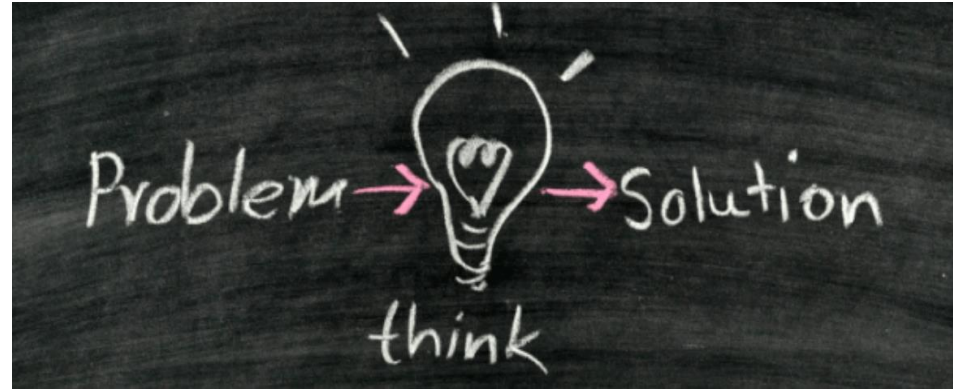

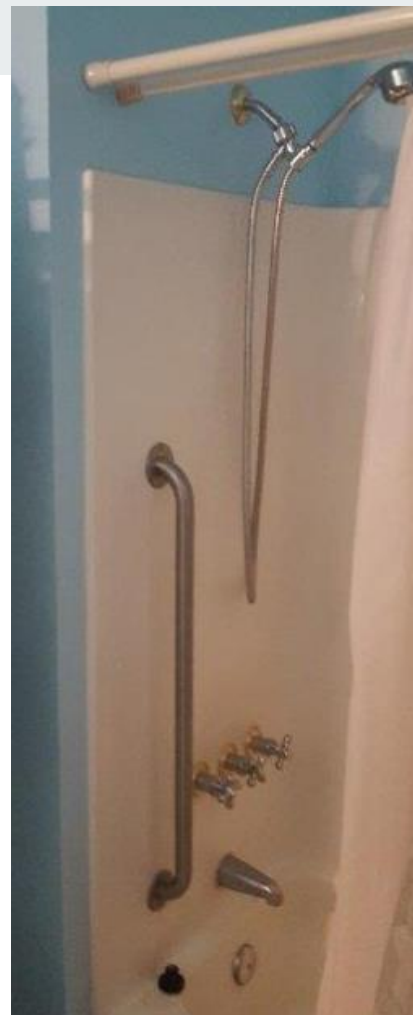




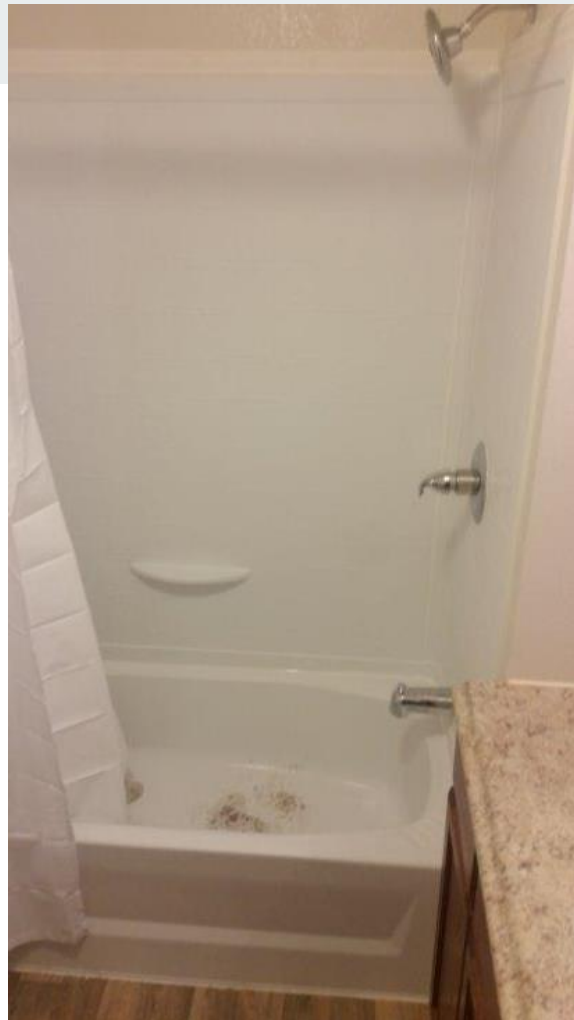
