TEN BASIC RESPONSIBILITIES OF NONPROFIT BOARDS

- 1. Determine mission and purposes, and advocate for them. It is the board's responsibility tocreate and review a statement of mission and purpose that articulates the organization's goals, means, and primary constituents served and advocate for their organization by "standing for their mission" (www. standforyourmission.org).
- 2. Select the chief executive. Boards must reach consensus on the chief executive's responsibilities and undertake a careful search to find the most qualified individual for the position.
- **3. Support and evaluate the chief executive.** The board should ensure that the chief executive has the moral and professional support he or she needs to further the goals of the organization.
- **4. Ensure effective planning.** Boards must actively participate in an overall planning process andassist in implementing and monitoring the plan's goals.
- **5. Monitor, and strengthen programs and services.** The board's responsibility is to determine which programs are consistent with the organization's mission and monitor their effectiveness.
- **6. Ensure adequate financial resources.** One of the board's foremost responsibilities is to secureadequate resources for the organization to fulfill its mission by actively, consistently, and strategically advocating for the organization's mission.
- **7. Protect assets and provide proper financial oversight.** The board must assist in developing theannual budget and ensuring that proper financial controls are in place.
- **8. Build and sustain a competent board.** All boards have a responsibility to articulate prerequisitesfor candidates, orient new members, and periodically and comprehensively evaluate their ownperformance.
- **9. Ensure legal and ethical integrity.** The board is ultimately responsible for adherence to legalstandards and ethical norms.
- **10. Enhance the organization's public standing.** The board should act as conscientious ambassadorswho clearly articulate and advocate for the organization's mission, accomplishments, and goalsto the public and garner support from the community.
